On **Wednesday, December 30, at 5 pm** in the Saint Paul's gymnasium, we are pleased to announce the **Second Annual Regulation Alumni Basketball Game** coupled with **Alumni Basketball Recognition Day**. The Alumni game will be played in between tournament games on the final day of the Gene Bennett Classic. Alumni recognitions will occur following the completion of the Alumni game and during the Championship game of the tournament which begins at 7:00.

Who Can Play? Only and all former **Varsity SPS Basketball Players** are eligible to play in the Alumni Game. Rosters are limited to a maximum of 40 players total.

Even if you are not eligible to play or do not wish to play in the game, we strongly encourage all alumni to come partake in the entertainment, as well as to remain and watch the Championship game of the tournament (**starts at 7 pm**) which our boys will be extra motivated to try and make. A post game reception will immediately follow in the lobby of the new gym.

Admission to the Alumni Game will be free to spectators, and the admission to the Championship game will be \$5. However, admission will be covered by the Alumni Department for the Varsity Basketball Alumni who will to watch the Championship game.

Note: All players must be in reasonable physical health and must sign a risk waiver. Conventional athletic attire will be required to play. Jerseys will be provided for the purposes of the game only. Players should arrive by 4:15 for warm up.
