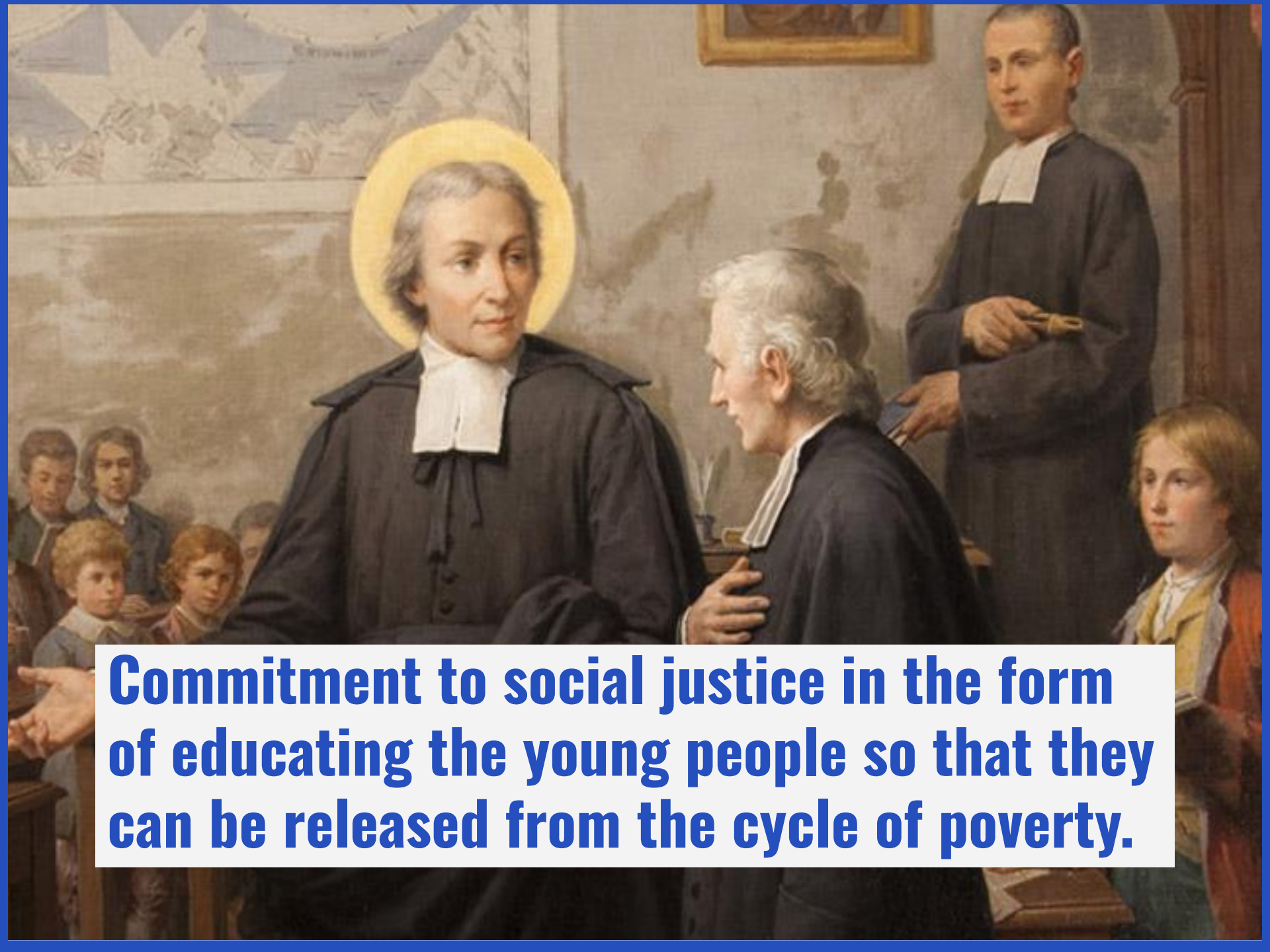

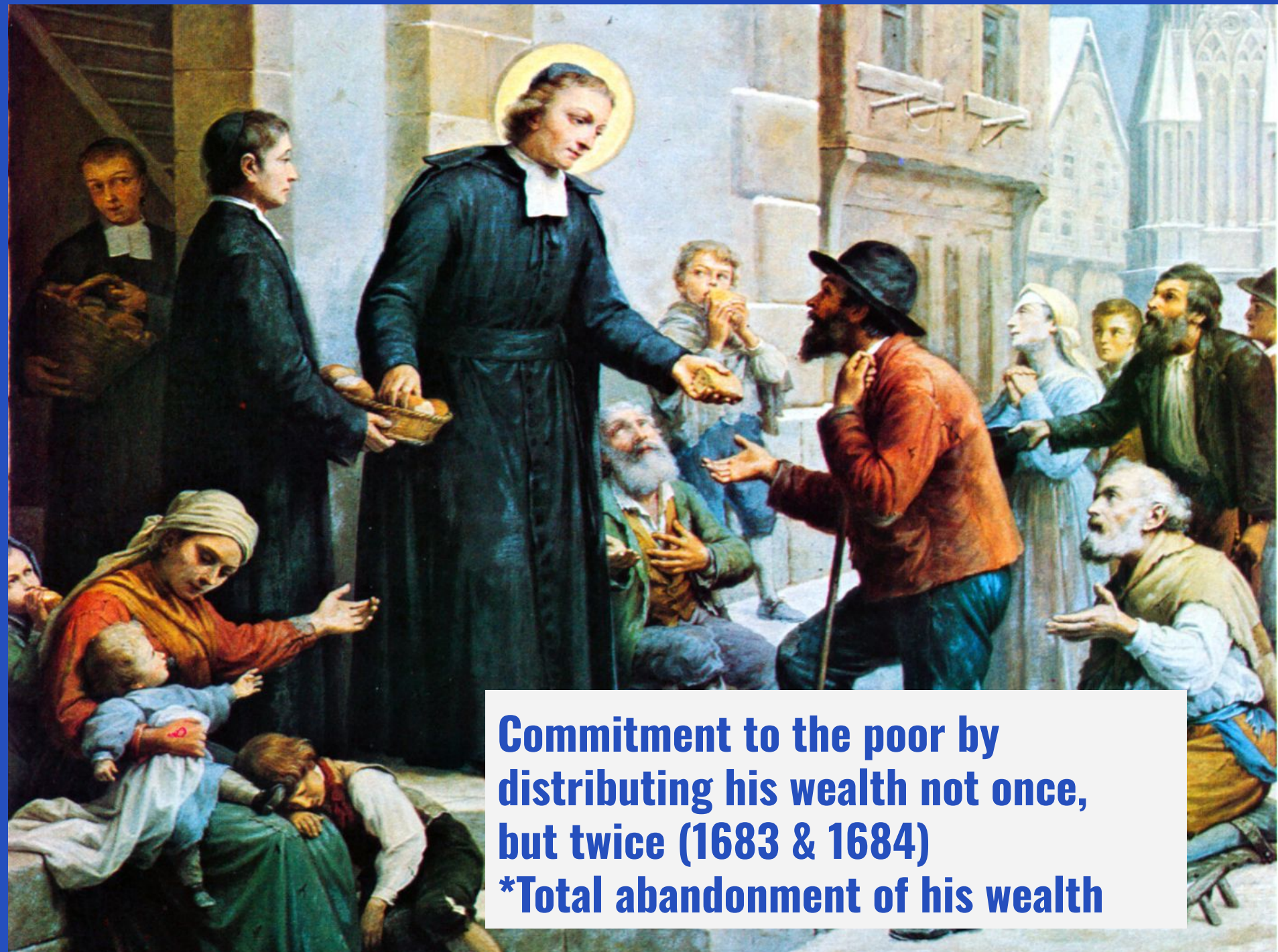


5 CORE PRINCIPLES OF LASALLIAN SCHOOLS

Twining Program

- **Begun in 1995**
- **A partnership with RELAN and 14 schools RELAF**
- **Why?- Receiving a quality Christian education in Africa is expensive.**
- **Most students are poor and even without families to support them**
- **Ministries try to subsidize cost by having students run day-to-day operations**
- **Twining donations go to: tuition cost, books, building development, etc**



Our Twin School: Saint Paul's Secondary School- Marsabit, Kenya



Our Twin School: Saint Paul's Secondary School- Marsabit, Kenya

- Established in 1990
- 150 students
- Receives 300-500 applications per year for 50 places.
- Tuition is \$800, but most students are not able to pay this.
- There have been heightened animosity between tribal groups in the area, which impacts the lives of the students
- Day begins at 4:45am, and students go to sleep by 9:45pm

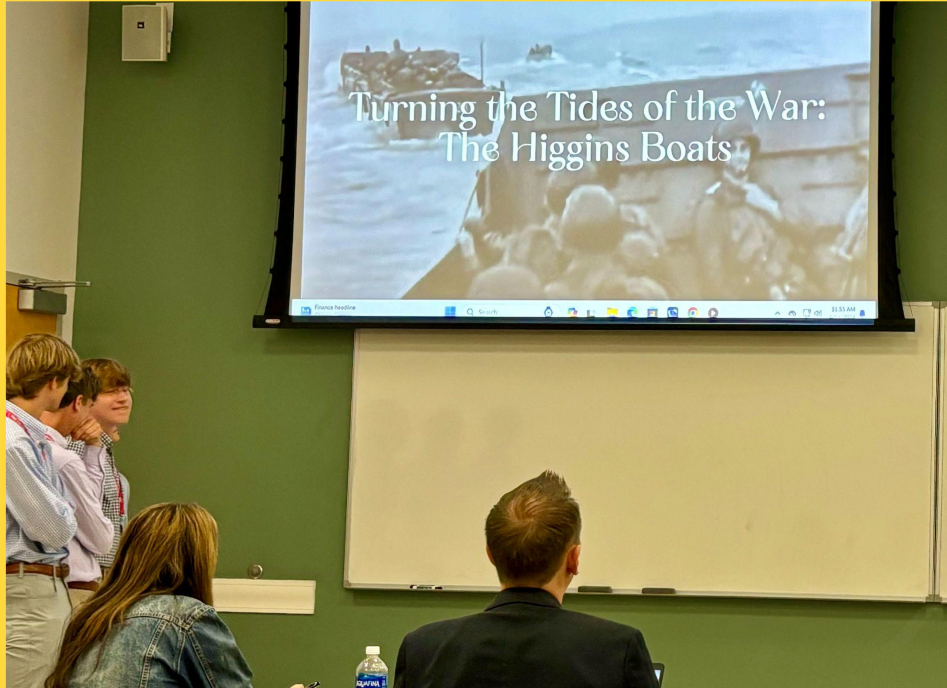

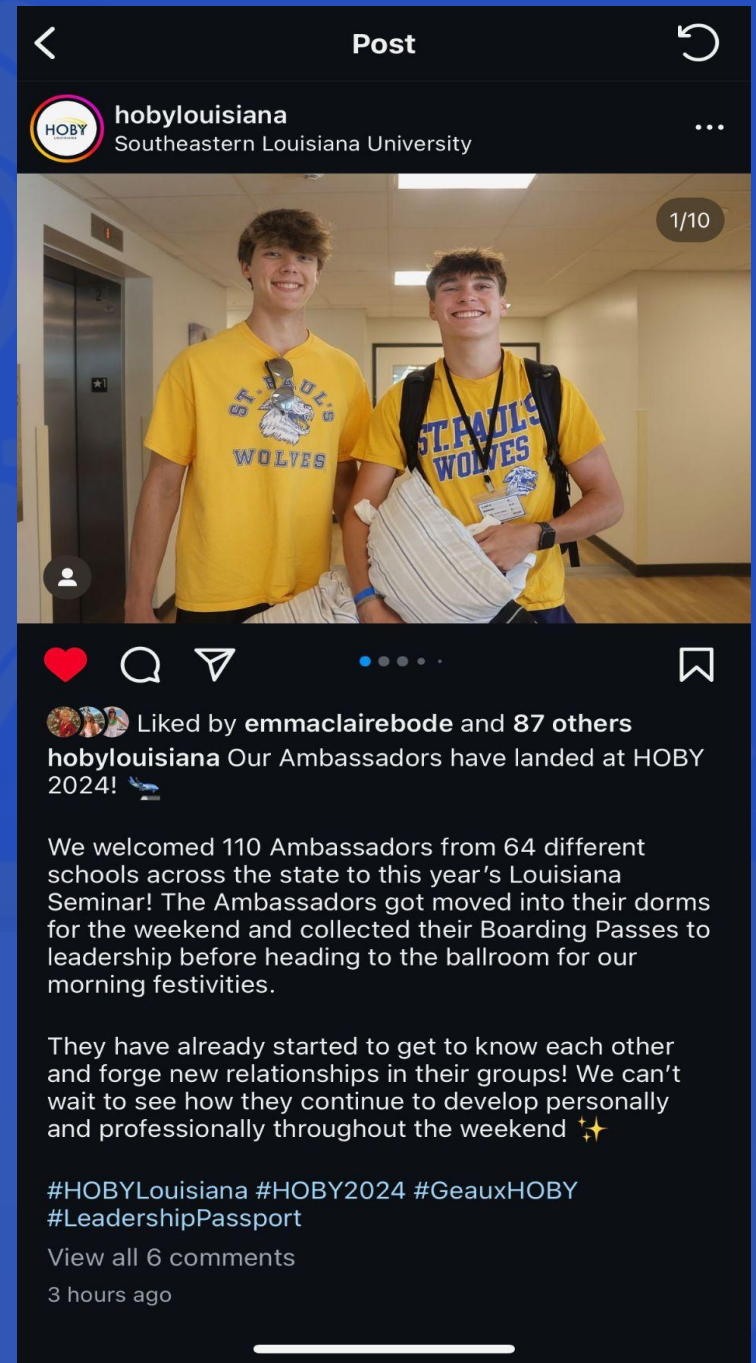
