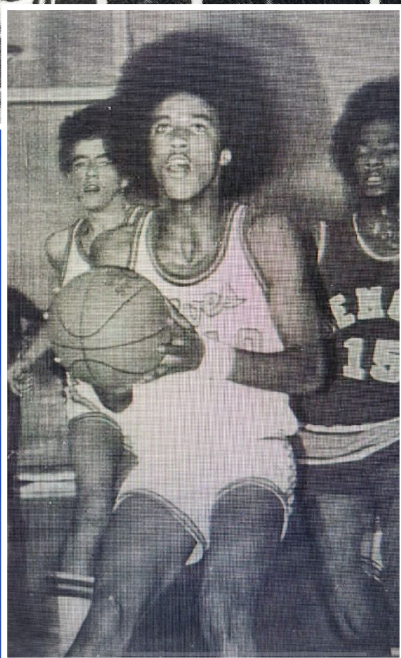

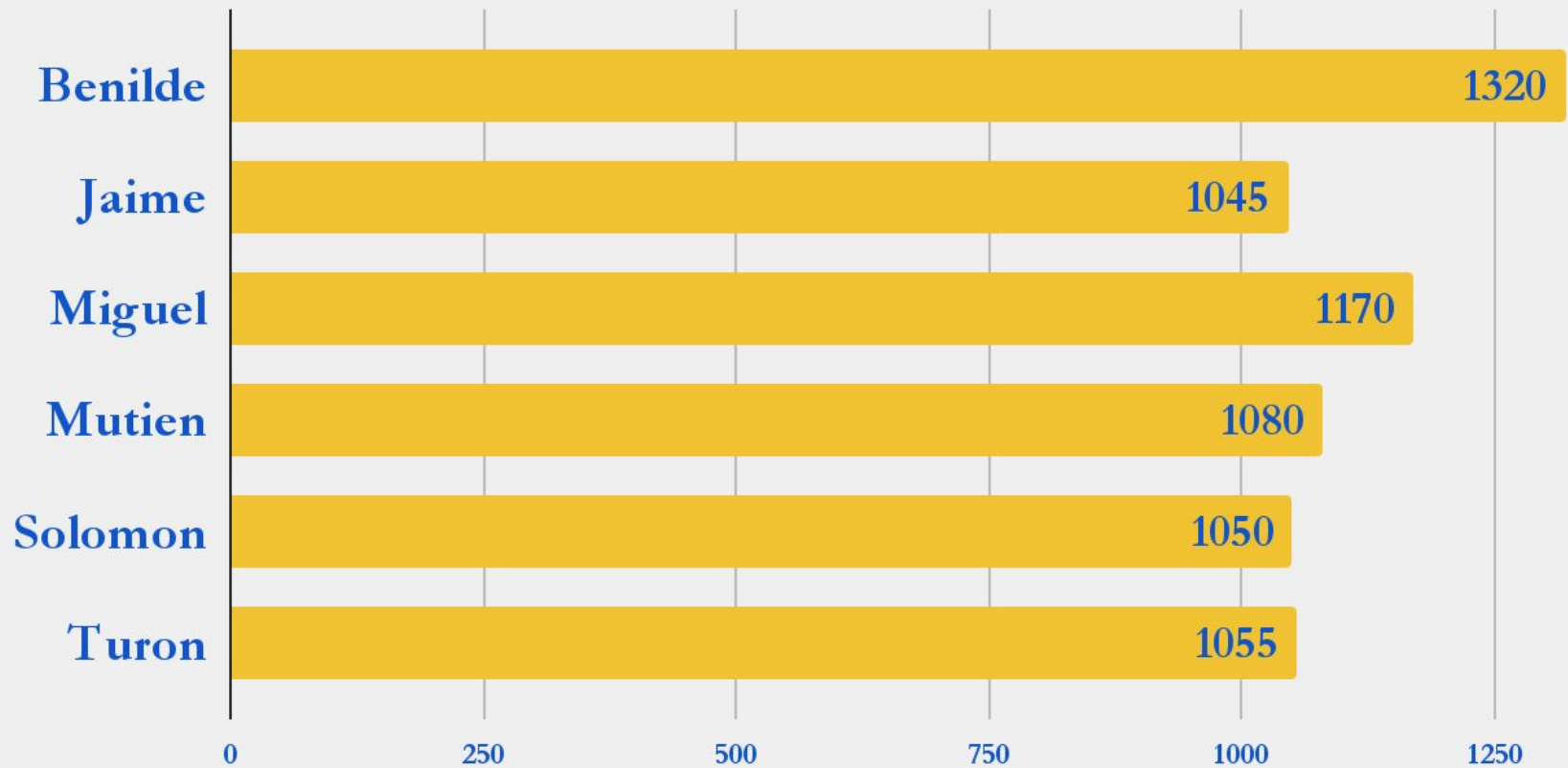

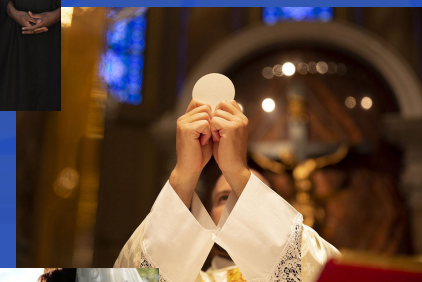

The SPS Wolves swimmers dominated the Northshore District Championships at PAC last week. They were crowned as champs for the 9th consecutive year. The Wolves were led by a total team effort with every single swimmer entered in the meet contributing to the point total for the team.

Top scorers were Jake Bergeron, first place in the 200 and 500 freestyle. Top 3 finishers were Senior Captain Fischer Redmond, Senior Captain Antonio Eversgerd, as well as Sophomore Chris Lobue, Daniel Eversgerd and Dominic Barcelona. In a show of dominance the Wolves swept all three relays competed.

In the Greater Metro championships, the team held strong to its team oriented focus and tallying enough points from all 11 swimmers who qualified for the meet. That catapulted the Wolves to a runner up team finish for the boys, improving from a 3rd place finish each of the last two seasons. Senior Captain Fischer Redmond finished 2nd place in the 50 free. Sophomore Jake Bergeron finished 3rd as well in the 200 freestyle.

Additional Overall scorers in the meet for the aqua Wolves are Antonio Eversgerd, Dominic Barcelona, Chris Lobue, Daniel Eversgerd, James Conner, Greyson Guevara, Leon Messa, Michael Breaux and Atlas Dyer. The Wolves will next compete at state in two weeks in Sulphur.
