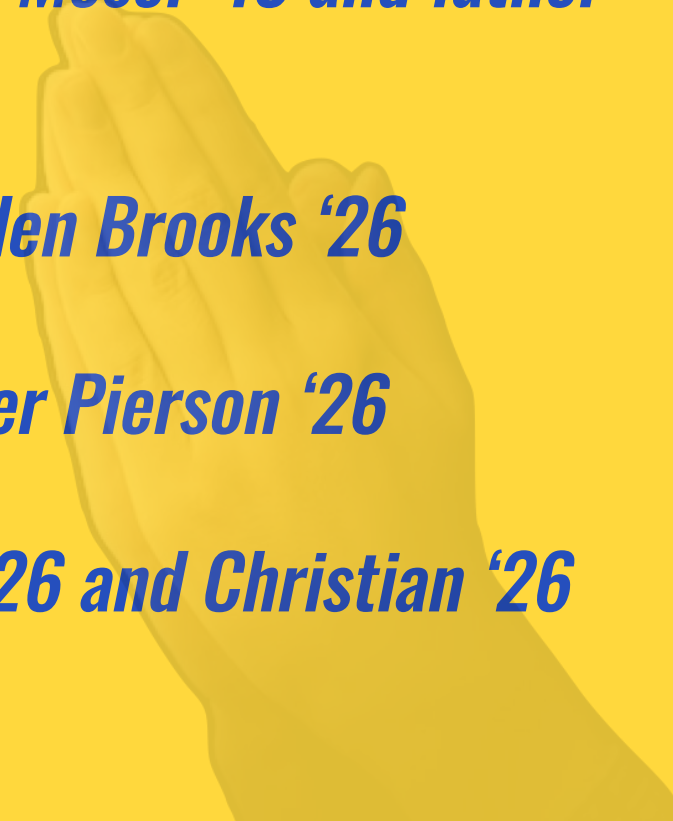

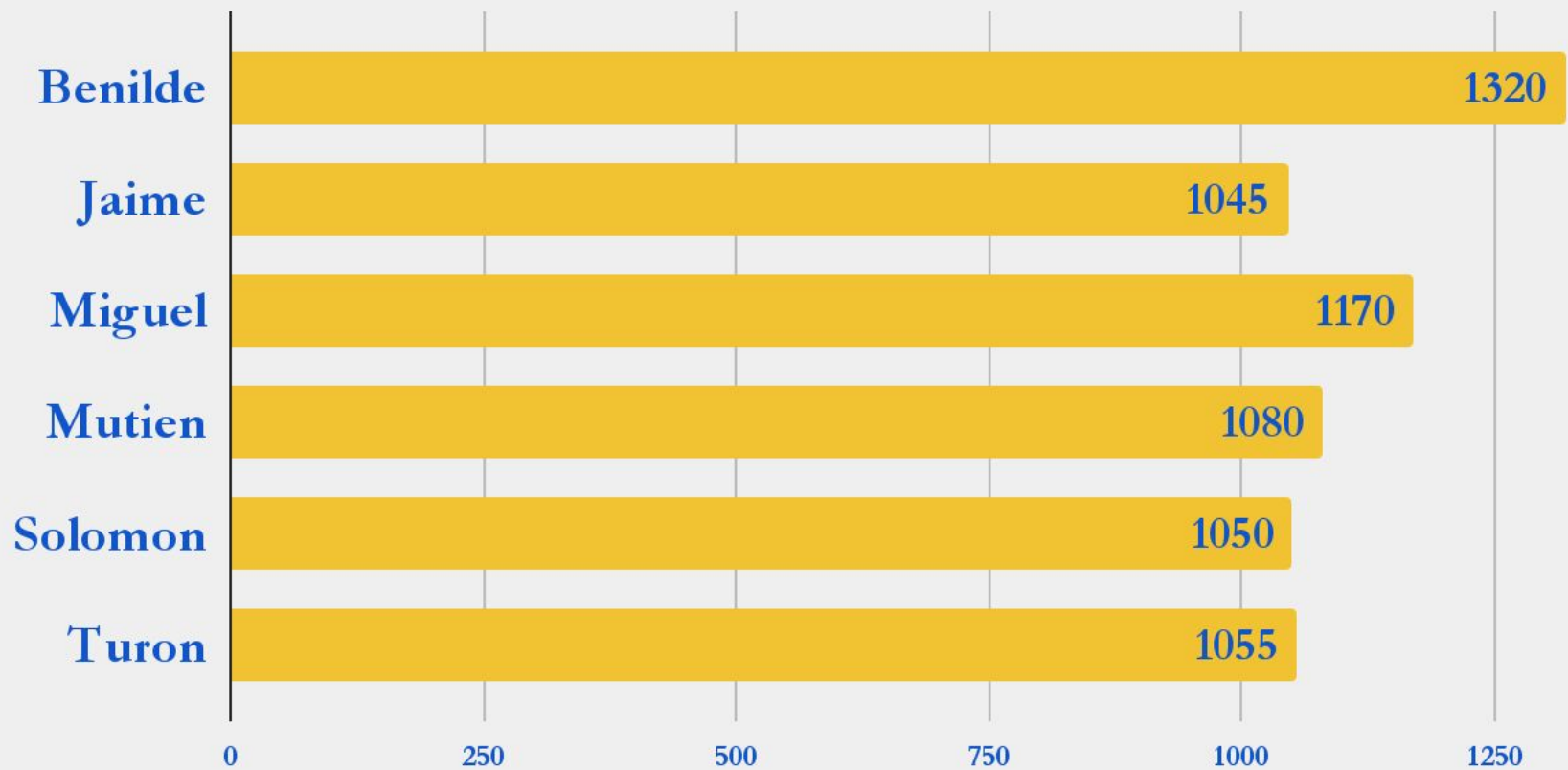

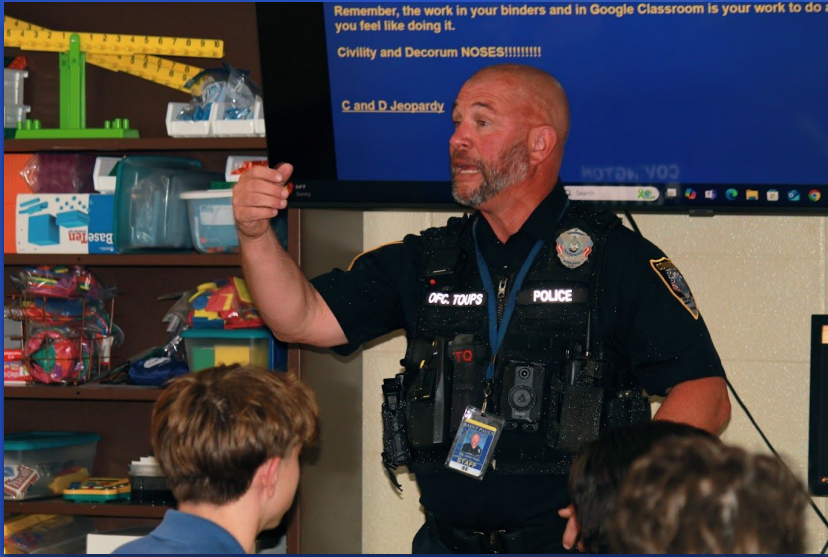

COURT OF APPEALS

St. Paul's senior Jacob Cresson and junior Matthew Gay attended an oral argument at the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit in New Orleans on October 8th. Mr. Jordan Siverd '97, father of a prefreshman and attorney, met with the students and Mrs. Kim Gardner beforehand to give an overview of the federal court system so they could appreciate the procedural background of the appeal. Mr. Siverd hosted the students at the courthouse, where they learned more about the history of the appeals court before making their way to the courtroom to watch attorneys for the defense and prosecution argue the issues before a panel of three circuit judges.

FIX IT CLUB

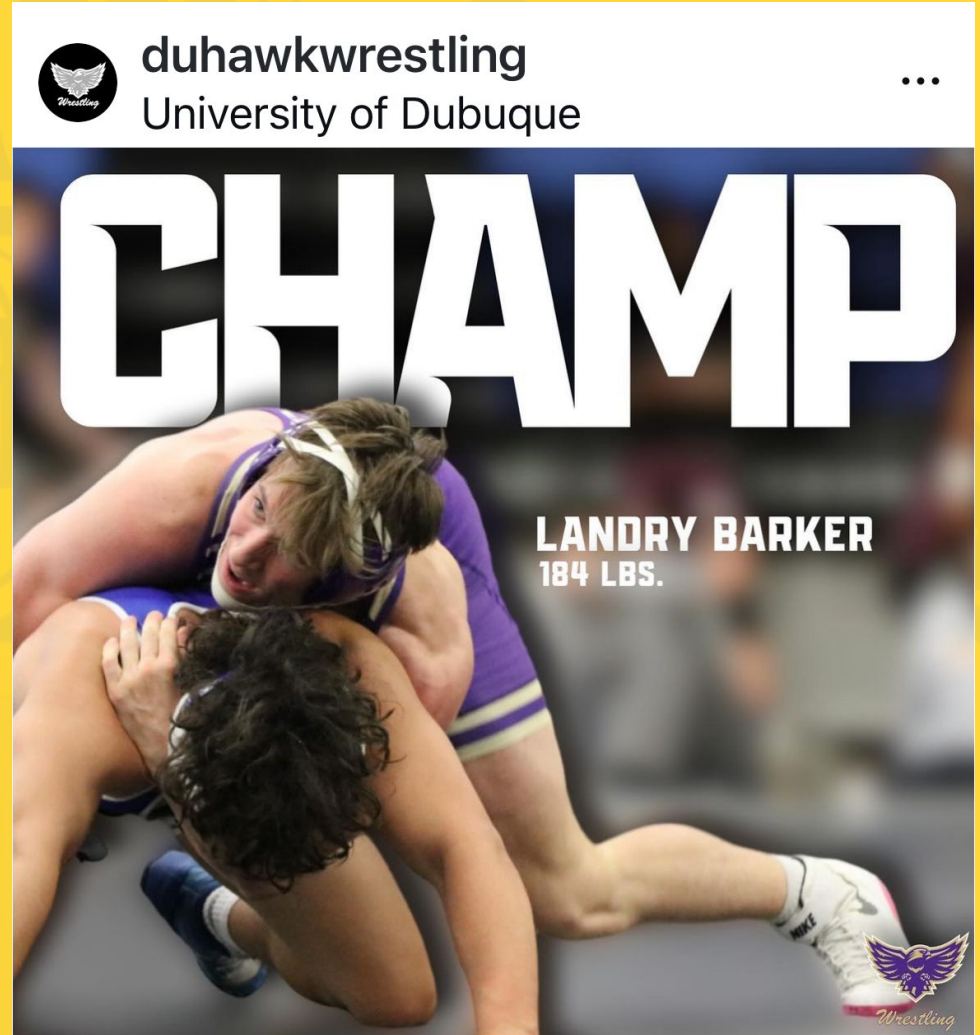
